GRANDVIEW RECEIVES LEED SILVER CERTIFICATION

PITTSBURGH (Nov. 15, 2011) — The Grandview at Longwood recently received LEED silver certification from the United States Green Building Council. The 89-unit apartment building is part of Longwood at Oakmont, a continuing care retirement community in Verona. Mistick Construction built the \$40 million dollar project in 2010. The Architect was Reese, Lower, Patrick & Scott, Ltd. (RLPS Architects).

The LEED green building rating system is developed and administered by the U.S. Green Building Council, a Washington D.C.-based, nonprofit coalition of building industry leaders. LEED-certified buildings are less costly to owners and reduce negative environmental impacts, improving occupant health and well-being. Silver is the second level of certification in the LEED process.
